#### **CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS**

# **Be Prompt**

- Remain in your assigned seat (unless you have permission to leave it for a class activity) until the dismissal bell rings.
- 3 tardies = 1 absence & detention.

#### **Be Prepared:**

- Bring all required materials and assignments to class each day. You must have these to enter the class! If not, you will return to your locker and will be tardy if you aren't prompt.
- For Study Skills 9: Planner, pencil, folders, notebooks, current assignments, and materials for Science 9, English 9, Civics or STEM, and Math. You may bring your textbooks for these classes, but you aren't expected to unless you are notified ahead of time.

# Be Diligent:

- Always give every task your best effort.
- Be on task at all times.
- If you finish all current work, begin reading your own "bonus read" or a "bonus read" from within the class.
- Write legibly.
- Complete your own assignments.

#### **REWARDS FOR MAKING POSITIVE CHOICES**

- Increased trust from teachers and peers
- Increased learning
- Better grades

- Positive phone call or e-mail to parent/guardian
- Respect from others and for yourself

# **CONSEQUENCES FOR MAKING NEGATIVE CHOICES**

- Decreased trust from teachers and peers
- Nonverbal reminder (eye contact, gesture, nod, proximity)
- Verbal warning
- Discussion after class and/or detention and/or loss of daily points
- Cell phones, ipods, headphones, etc. that are out without prior approval or at inappropriate times may be confiscated and may be taken to the office.
- Parent phone call or e-mail
- Conference with parent, teacher, principal, and student
- Significant disruption (physically dangerous behavior, illegal acts, or insubordinate behavior): Student will be sent immediately to the office.
- Recurring significant disruptions: Student and teacher will meet with guidance counselor and/or principal to create an appropriate plan going forward.
